MISSION FOCUS

Our Persecuted Brothers and Sisters in Nigeria and Niger

We must not forget our brothers and sisters in Christ all over the world who are paying a high price for remaining faithful to the Lord in countries hostile to our faith.

Nigeria is one of the most dangerous places in the world to live as a Christian. Many have been murdered, and countless have been abducted. On the morning of January 18, Christians were gathered to worship when armed assailants yelling "Allahu Akbar" stormed into three separate congregations, and kidnapped 173 people. Seven escaped, but most remain missing.

One woman, Afiniki Moses, had just been released on January 15 from a separate kidnapping incident, after her family paid the ransom. During the January 18 raids, her husband and two children were abducted and remain in captivity.

In Niger, we wait for news on 48-year-old American missionary pilot Kevin Rideout who was kidnapped almost four months ago from a secure neighbourhood in Niamey, Niger. His kidnapping contributed to the need for Sahel Academy to be shut down, and require Chuck and Sam to come back to Canada. For a clearer understanding of that situation, take some time to talk to Chuck.

Please Pray for the protection, endurance and safe return of all those still in captivity, asking God to sustain them physically, emotionally and spiritually as they await their rescue. And as we pray, we can ask the Lord for this same grace towards every believer facing similar peril, throughout the world.
