Behind the Scenes of World Missions

Whether in remote communities or urban centers, Pioneers Canada makes their home among those with no access to the gospel. With 400+ teams worldwide and deep roots in the local church, they seek to reach the over two billion people worldwide who still have no access to the Good News of Jesus Christ. They live in regions where there are no churches, no believers and no one to tell them about Jesus.

Arley continues to serve in a volunteer capacity behind the scenes, now removed from hearing some of the more exciting front lines stories, he does behind-the-scenes marketing. While Arley has commented that the work he does is "probably the second-least interesting work happening in missions", he also shares that they are launching an intranet lining up Brazil, Europe and Dominican Republic websites, and making marketing templates for missionaries to talk to churches while on home assignment / furlough.

As with the body life of a local church, mission ventures require many people of different gifting, working together to advance the Kingdom. As the men and women of Pioneers Canada do that work, let's pray for God to bless their efforts with new believers welcomed into the family of God, and for those believers to be built up to maturity in the Faith.
